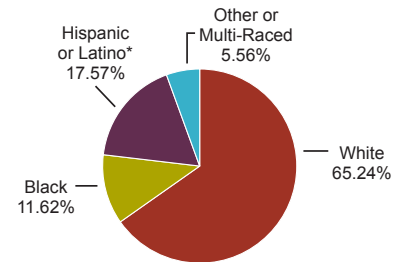

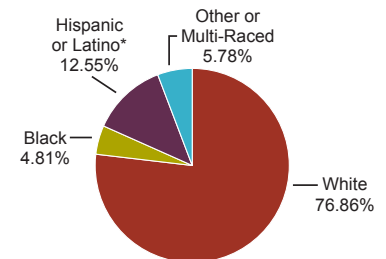

RACIAL MAKEUP OF HUMAN SERVICES WORKFORCE

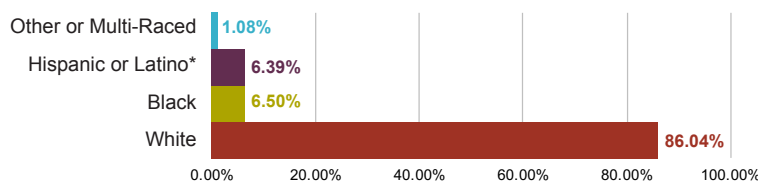


RACIAL MAKEUP OF OVERALL WORKFORCE



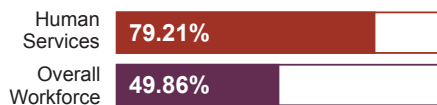

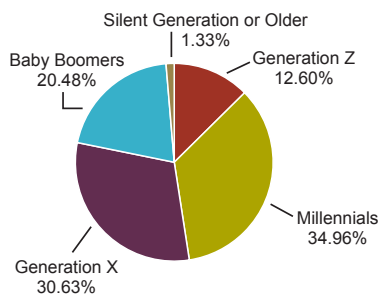

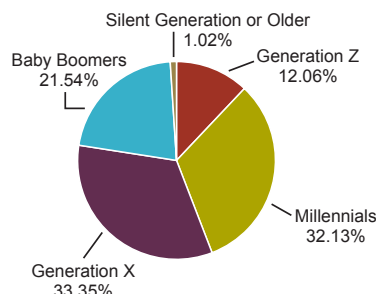
MEDIAN AGE OF WORKERS



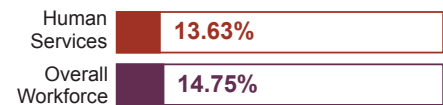
GENERATIONAL MAKEUP OF HUMAN SERVICES WORKFORCE



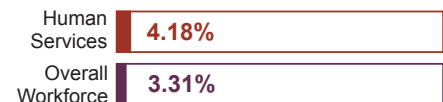
GENERATIONAL MAKEUP OF OVERALL WORKFORCE



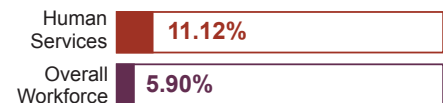
FOREIGN BORN WORKERS

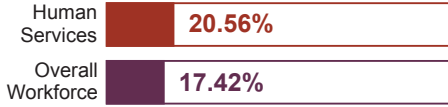

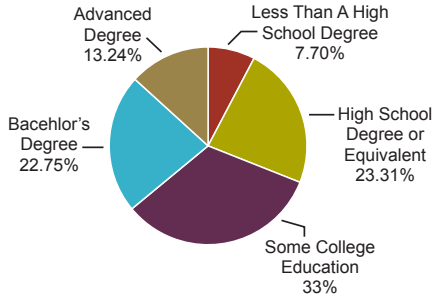

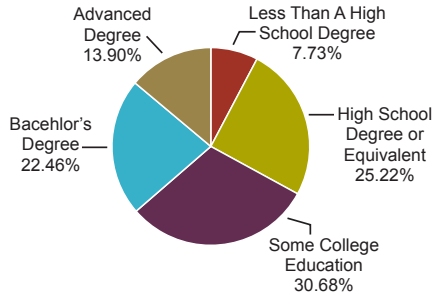

EDUCATION LEVEL OF HUMAN SERVICES



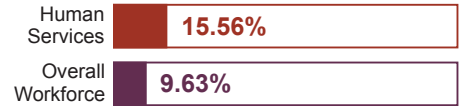
EDUCATION LEVEL OF OVERALL WORKFORCE



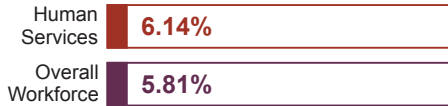
MEDIAN HOURLY WAGE



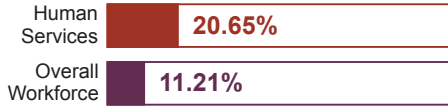
WORKERS LIVING BELOW THE POVERTY LINE

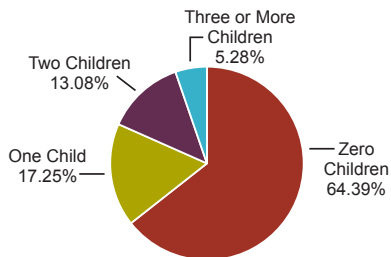

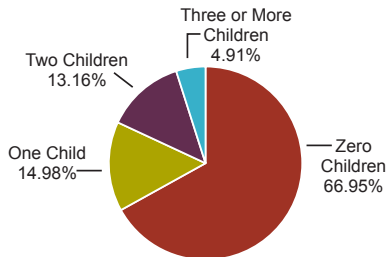
ANNUAL STATE AND LOCAL TAXES DIRECTLY PAID BY WORKERS IN THE HUMAN SERVICES SUBSECTOR

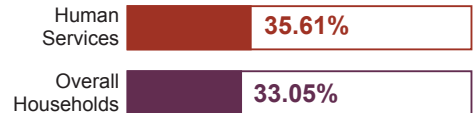
NUMBER OF CHILDREN PER HUMAN SERVICES HOUSEHOLDS



NUMBER OF CHILDREN PER OVERALL HOUSEHOLDS



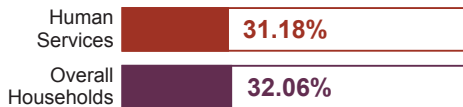
HOUSEHOLDS WITH CHILDREN
